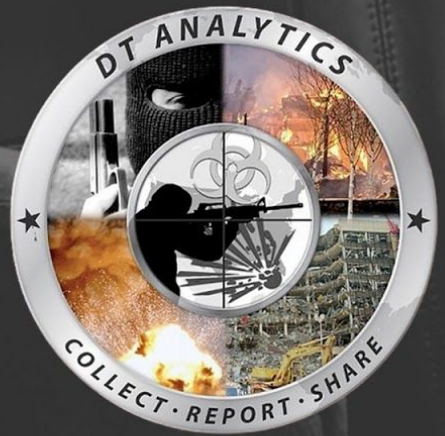

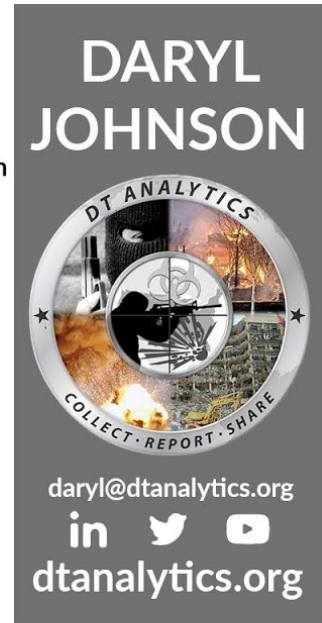

DT Analytics was created in September 2010 to provide increased visibility, quality analysis, and expert consultation on domestic extremist activity within the United States. The company's name is derived from its primary purpose: to analyze the forces and factors that influence domestic terrorism (DT) activity. Daryl hopes to educate a broad audience about the possible dangers and potential threats related to this current and very relevant subject.

The thought of creating a small business to monitor domestic extremist activity in the United States was first envisioned in May 2009. At the time, the idea was more of a passing thought—simply put, it was wishful thinking. The whole thing seemed like an overwhelming and unattainable task. It would take nearly a year for an opportunity to present itself. Ultimately, through unwavering dedication, pure determination and lots of hard work, Daryl was able to take a fleeting idea, create a vision and eventually turn it into a reality. His raw passion for the subject also provided a strong incentive and the necessary will power needed for the incorporation of DT Analytics.

Daryl Johnson is one of the foremost experts on domestic terrorism in the U.S. Beginning his career as a civilian in the U.S. Army, he has held several government positions, most recently as senior analyst at the Department of Homeland Security. He is the Owner of DT Analytics, a private consulting firm for law enforcement, academia, and other organizations.

In 2020, Daryl was invited to serve as an Honorary Board member for We Are Many-United Against Hate in Madison, Wisconsin. He also accepted the position of Non-Resident Fellow at the Center for Global Policy in Washington, D.C. In 2019, Daryl co-founded Jolly & Johnson Consulting to provide specialized training for BSA/AML professionals.

Johnson is regularly cited, featured, or quoted in the media, including the New York Times, Washington Post, Wall Street Journal, Newsweek, National Public Radio, MSNBC, CNN, and NBC Nightly News, among many others at home and abroad. He is the author of "Hateland: A Long, Hard Look at America's Extremist Heart" (Prometheus Books, 2019) and "Right-Wing Resurgence: How a Domestic Terrorism Threat Is Being Ignored" (Rowman & Littlefield, 2012). Daryl is also a freelance writer for various media and civil rights organizations. In 2012, he testified before the Senate Judiciary Committee on hate crimes and the threat of domestic extremism.

Daryl Johnson has written two books on the topic of domestic extremist movements and activities: *Hate Land* and *Right Wing Resurgence*.

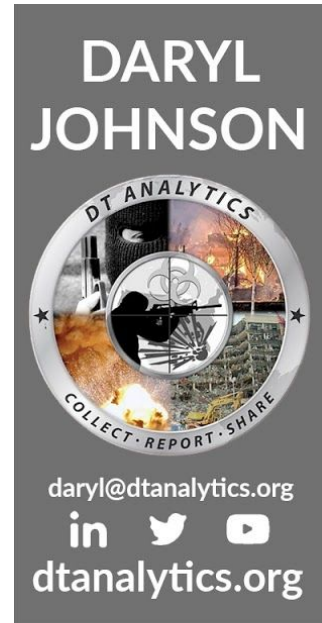
